**Amendment to Water Service Agreement with Cherry Creek Valley  
Contract # 05206A – Master Meter 174**

Information

Cherry Creek Valley Water and Sanitation District (CCV) shares a long and somewhat erratic boundary with the City of Denver in the vicinity of Cherry Creek and the High Line Canal. As a master meter distributor, CCV owns and operates the water distribution system within its service area, and bills its customers for water provided by the Board. Some undeveloped areas in the City are located far from Board facilities but close to existing CCV facilities. The reverse is also true.

The proposed amendment will allow the transfer of responsibility for water service from one entity to the other in those areas, to eliminate the need for expensive and duplicative water infrastructure. Both CCV and the Board will be able to provide better service to customers. A similar arrangement with the City of Glendale has worked well for several years. Property in the City to be served by CCV will pay the Inside-City SDC to the Board, along with all fees normally charged by CCV. Property in CCV's service area that could more efficiently be served by the Board will be classified as Total Service areas, and will be charged Total Service rates.

The first property to proceed under this arrangement is a development located in the City near Parker Road south of East Florida Avenue. The developer understands the transfer of water service and is anxious to proceed.

Recommendation:


It is recommended that the Board approve the amendment to Water Service Agreement MM 174 with Cherry Creek Valley Water and Sanitation District.
