



Ashland Reservoir Tank 1 Base Slab Concrete Pour

Dear Resident,

The time has come for the Ashland Reservoir Tank Replacement Projects first big concrete pour. The concrete placement for the first tanks base slab is requiring roughly 1250 Cubic Yards of concrete. This large amount of concrete requires WSCI to reserve our concrete supplier's batch plant for the whole day. Since we need to reserve the batch plant for a day, the pour must take place during a weekend. The City of Wheat Ridge has granted WSCI and our concrete subcontractor to pour our first tanks base slab this Saturday, January 18th.

Due to the small amount of available space around the project site, driving restrictions will be set in place for the day. Fenton St. between 29th avenue and 30th avenue will be limited to one way traffic north bound and no parking will be allowed on the west side of the street. 30th Avenue between Fenton St. and Harlan St will be limited to one way traffic west bound and no public parking will be available. Harlan St. between 30th Avenue and 32nd Avenue will be limited to one way traffic north bound.

A viewing station will be set up for the public on the corner of 30th Avenue and Gray St for local residents and guests to observe the concrete placement. The viewing station will be in-between the existing East Basin, and the new under construction West Tank. The pour is to begin at 6:00 am on Saturday and will go late into the night. The noise will be limited after the concrete is placed which will end around 5:00 pm.
